## AAUW Extends Eligibility

Long Beach State College is among 15 colleges and universities which have been added to the list of institutions meeting requirements for membership in the American Association of University Women, according to an announcement by Mrs. Ronald Webb, membership chairman of the Manhattan Beach branch, which serves women of the Torrance area. Women graduates of these schools are now eligible for membership in the AAUW.

To be recognized for AAUW membership, these institutions must maintain high academic standards and a substantial orientation to a foundation in the liberal arts, extend professional recognition to women on faculties and in administration, make adequate provision for women students, and maintain academic freedom.

The other new institutions added to the approved list by vote of the AAUW Board of Directors on recommendation of the Association's Committee on Higher Education are: Sacramento State College; University of California at Riverside; Bemidji

State College, Bemidji, Minn.; Berry College, Mount Berry, Ga.; D'Youville College, Buffalo, N.Y.; Kutztown State College, Kutztown, Pa.

Also included are: Northeastern State College, Tahlequah, Okla.; Ohio Northern University, Ada, Ohio; Roosevelt University, Chicago, Ill.; Southeastern State College, Durant, Okla.; State College at Bridgewater, Bridgewater, Mass.; Susquehanna University, Selingsgrove, Pa.; West Virginia State College, Institute, W. Va.; and Wisconsin State College, La Crosse, Wis.

The Manhattan Beach Branch offers members a study-action program covering the fields of higher education, elementary and secondary education, international relations, social and economic issues, status of women, mass media and the arts.

The Association also supports a legislative program, voted by delegates to its biennial conventions. Members participate in the Fellowships Program which awards about 100 fellowships

each year with stipends amounting to \$275,000 to women scholars for advanced study.
