South Bay's First Ice Arena to Open Soon in Torrance

Scheduled to open this month will be the South Bay's first ice arena — The Olympic Ice Arena, located at 23770 So. Western in Torrance, the facility will approximate \$750,000 in cost and is being financed by investors in Torrance, Palos Verdes and Los Angeles.

According to general manager Ian Pinkerton, the ice surface will be regulation hockey size (17,000 sq. ft.)—large enough for the Junior Hockey League' planned, as well as home grown ice shows.

An ambitious schedule of events is planned, according to Pinkerton, including curling (the ice skating version of bowling), moonlight sessions, and lunch and brunch sessions for housewives.

Pinkerton emphasized that the sport of ice skating is healthy, wholesome and fun and that everything will be done to keep it that way. "This is the kind of a place parents take their children and are sure of their safety and well being—the rink will brook no rowdyism whatsoever."

Located on Western just north of Narbonne High School, the arena will offer private, semi-private, and group lessons from the finest instructors, including medalists and show skaters. A special tog shop will offer the latest in skating fashions and equipment. Skating rentals and repairs will also be offered.

Skaters may warm themselves around a sunken 18' fireplace which was designed to be a congenial place to chat. Hungry skaters will eat at the Skaters' Snob Bar. The Snob Bar will also cater special parties such as birthday parties. A special club room will be available for this purpose as well as for the meeting of clubs.

Adjoining the arena will be the Silver Skate Restaurant and Coffee Shop. To be operated by John Haretakis, the restaurant will feature an expanse of 80 feet in thermopane glass which will overlook the ice and provide a continuous show for diners. No one in skates will be admitted to the restaurant and entrance to the restaurant is separate from the arena.
