Senior Citizens Rival Newlyweds

Senior citizens today are rivaling young newlyweds as the prime targets of real estate developers.

The federal government through the Federal Housing Administration is encouraging such projects and amendments to federal housing legislation enacted by the last session of Congress has made them easier to launch than ever before.

Particular encouragement and legislative incentive has been given non-profit organizations wishing to provide housing for older people.

Section 231 added to federal housing law last year permits FHA to insure 100 per cent financing for projects sponsored by "Financially qualified organizations acceptable to the commissioner."

The section permits insurance of loans up to \$12,500,000 for terms to 40 years for such projects. While some liberalization has been made in the actual monetary allowances, the biggest changes facilitate the application.
