'Special' Home-Seekers Look for Families Located in Torrance, Nearby Areas

Adoptions have increased sharply in number in Torrance and other nearby communities, yet children remain available for more families, according to Ernest E. Debs, chairman of the county board of supervisors.

Placements by the county bureau of adoptions were up 33 percent to total 1203 for the fiscal year just ended.

Most of the children placed were of plain, ordinary, Anglo-American background, but many were of Negro, Oriental, Indian, Mexican, or mixed parentage.

Exceedingly interesting babies with exotic backgrounds, a full baker's dozen of them, are currently looking for parents through the County Bureau, Debs said.

CROSSROADS

Requirements were reported to be simple and common sense by Walter A. Heath, Director of the Bureau. He stated that they included a happy and stable marriage of at least two years' duration, love of children and recognition that boys and girls of mixed parentage may need additional understanding and help, and the ability to live within the available income.

YOUNGER FAMILIES

Families should be young enough to see a child through a maturity. The usual age limit is 40 for the wife and 35 for the husband, although exceptions are made when necessary to provide a home for a child.

There is no limit on the number of children already in the family. Persons of all religions are served, although the natural mother's religious preference for her child, if she has one, governs the selection of a family for any specific child.

Immediate attention is given applicants for special children, Heath said. Families desiring Anglo-Protestant and Jewish children are required to wait a few months, because children are not available in sufficient numbers to take care of all families immediately.
