Ministers Attend District Assembly

The Courageous Ministers District Assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses concluded Aug. 12, at the Orange County Fairgrounds with a peak attendance of 13,521 at the public lecture at 3 p.m.

Floyd Garrett, a special representative of the Watchtower Society of New York, spoke on the subject, "Take Courage — God's Kingdom Is At Hand."

"Hundreds of millions have heard God's Kingdom mentioned but have not understood what this divine government means to mankind. For order and peace to take place of selfish, deadly confusion here on earth, it will require action by this God, whose law is perfect," Garrett said.

"The people have had their opportunity; and God is permitting them to have their own way or choice has not benefited them, to judge by the results. God's time for permitting this way of running the earth is near its end. His time is at hand to set-up the Kingdom."

"It is because of the relief and the blessings that God's Kingdom will bring, not after our day, but within our very own generation, that all should take courage from this fact," Garrett stated.

All local delegates have returned and regular meetings will resume at the local Kingdom Hall this week. A small crew of volunteers spent Monday and Tuesday dismantling installations at the fairgrounds.

There were 226 new ministers of the Witnesses baptized Saturday, following an address by Russell Cantwell, circuit minister. The newly ordained ministers will undergo training in the local congregation for field preaching.
