**Employment Hike Hits Record High**

Total employment in the Los Angeles-Long Beach-Orange County Area rose seasonally from 2,880,800 in June to 2,890,500 in July, establishing a record high for the third consecutive month. Irving H. Perless, Director of Employment, announced today.

Unemployment followed the customary summer pattern, dropping from 175,600 to 165,800 as the influx of temporary jobseekers tapered off. The rate of unemployment decreased from 5.7 percent of the civilian labor force in June to 5.4 percent in July.

The month-to-month job gains were centered in the manufacturing sector paced by a continued expansion in the aerospace industries. Employment in electronics and ordnance advanced to new highs, while renewed hiring by aircraft firms boosted current employment in that industry to the highest in nearly two years.

Seasonal gains were registered in food processing and toy manufacturing. In addition, sizable upswings were posted in chemicals and instruments during the past month. Employment gains in most nonmanufacturing industries, however, were counterbalanced by a sharp seasonal decline in government as a result of the closing of schools for summer vacation.

Compared with July a year ago, total employment was up 126,100, or 4.6 percent. Widespread gains were recorded in all major non-agricultural industries, but manufacturing led the upturn with the addition of 57,000 jobs since last July.

Unemployment also reflected the improvement in the economy since last year. Current unemployment was down 40,800, or nearly 20 percent from the year earlier total of 206,600.

**Autopsy Planned in Traffic Death**

TORRANCE — An autopsy was scheduled recently in the death of a Compton man whose car rammed a concrete abutment Aug. 17 the Harbor Freeway.

Dead in the accident is Claude S. Miles, 38, apparent victim of a heart attack.

California Highway Patrol investigators said Miles' car struck a bridge supporting column at the San Diego Freeway interchange. He suffered a heart attack or other seizure before crashing, investigators theorized.

Miles was pronounced dead on arrival at Harbor General Hospital.
