Super-Modified Racers Compete

Chuck Townsen of Gardena, Jay East of Colton and Vallie Engelauf of Riverside will head a field of 50 CJA Super-Modified auto racing drivers in Sunday afternoon's nine-event racing card at Western Speedway 139th St. and So. Western Ave. in Gardena, where racing will get under way at 2:30 p.m. Time trials will start at 1 p.m.

Townsen, who has captured two feature victories at Western already this year, will unveil a brand new Corvette-powered car for this week's nine event racing card, sponsored by the Santa Ana Moose Lodge.

East, who has three main-event triumphs this year at Western, guns another Corvette powered car, as will Engelauf, winner of two mains this season. Engelauf captured the feature event on his last outing at Western, three weeks ago. Besides winning two main events he also holds the one, 10, 30, and 40-lap track records at Western. His time for one-lap was 15.25 or 78.819 miles per hour, faster than any type of car had ever turned the speedy one-third mile oval.

Another threat will be "Tiger" Jim Roessler of San Bernardino, 1960-61 CJA champion and the winner of four features at Western this year. He will drive a Corvette-powered car.

Besides Townsen's new car, George Durade of Los Angeles will have his new T-bird-powered roadster type machine. The engine will be tilted over on its side with the driveshaft running along the left side of the car, similar to the cars that race at Indianapolis in the 500-mile race.
