Friday night will be novice night for beginning drivers. The faster and more experienced drivers will race Saturday night and all day Monday.

A large field of top car and drivers from all over Southern California are expected to participate. For this special race meet there will be team races, Australian pursuit races, and a 40-lap main event.

Quarter midgets are driven by youngsters from the ages of four through 15. The races are run with the same midgets and sprint cars.
