Loan Activity Shows Increase

GI loan activity registered another across-the-board increase except starts in the month of July. Mort Webster, manager of VA's Southern California Regional Office, announced.

Up nearly 500 compared to the month of June, home loan applications at 2,617 were the highest they have been since October 1958.

VA starts were down to 692 from 783 in June. Appraisal requests for new units were up to 2,529 in July, from 1,751 in June. Appraisal requests for existing units at 1,690 topped the June total of 1,512.
