Board Approves Sign for School

The student body of Torrance High School requested approval from the Torrance Board of Education to purchase and install a coming events sign in front of the main building.

Having consulted the school architect, it was revealed that the sign would fit the design of the master plan for Torrance High School. The rehabilitation of the school, which will be completed by 1964, has been planned by the architect in a way that will harmoniously blend the traditional main building with the modern additions.

Eight-Day Registration Set

An eight-day registration period for children who will enter kindergarten for the first time next month will be held in all elementary schools of the Los Angeles City School System, according to Associate Superintendent Robert J. Purdy.

The pre-school registration period will begin on Tuesday, Sept. 4, and continue on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, Sept. 5, 6 and 7. All schools will be closed on admission day, Sept. 10, a legal holiday.

Signups resume on Tuesday, Sept. 11, and continue Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, Sept. 12, 13 and 14. School starts on Monday, Sept. 17.

Purdy reported district-wide 52,000 children are expected to sign up for kindergarten courses, but not all will be able to attend classes this fall.

Because of budget limitations the school district was not able to hire 75 kindergarten teachers and build classrooms needed to meet this semester's projected enrollment increase.

This will leave the district short of classroom space and teachers for an estimated 4000 youngsters.

Pupils will be accepted for kindergarten on the basis of the oldest first, Purdy said. The younger students will go on waiting lists and will start school in February.

Children entering kindergarten next month must be five years old on or before Dec. 1, 1962 under provisions of the California Education Code, while children entering the first grade must have reached their sixth birthday, also on Dec. 1.

Children registering must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. However, for convenience of working parents, children may be registered by an adult so designated by the parent or guardian.

Proof of age is required for admission to either kindergarten or first grade. Acceptable documents are a birth certificate, duly at-

Corporation Names Kiesler Head of Finance, Control

John T. Kiesler, a Torrance resident, has been appointed head, finance and control, for Aerospace Corporation's San Bernardino Operations, S. Vaughn Andrews, assistant vice president, administration, announced. Since coming to Aerospace Corporation in October, 1960, he has been divisional budget administrator for the Administration Division.

Aerospace Corporation, organized in the public interest, serves the United States Government — principally the Air Force — in scientific-engineering planning, general systems engineering and technical direction of space and advanced ballistic missile programs. Corporate programs at the company's San Bernardino Operations will be in support of the Ballistic Systems Division of the Air Force Systems Command.

Two Local Firms Fill Contracts

Two Torrance firms are now engaged in filling contracts for the Lockheed Missiles and Space Company at Sunnyvale.

The firms are Kerr Products Division, Space Equipment Corp., which is filling a \$26,000 contract to provide plastic satellite nose cones, and Vickers Inc., Aerospace Division, which is filling a \$745,090 contract to provide motor pump assemblies.

The nose cone project is slated to be completed next month and the pump assemblies are slated to be completed in June.

It is Lockheed's policy to award contracts when feasible to small business firms, according to Harry W. Kohl, procurement director.

As prime contractor for the Navy's Polaris fleet ballistic missile system and manufacturer of the Agena satellite vehicle — the nation's most effective mobile launching platform in space — utilized in a number of Air Force research and development programs as well as earth-orbiting and deep space missions for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Lockheed Missiles & Space Company thus far this year has awarded 5000 sub-contracts and 5000 contracts to firms and suppliers in all parts of the nation.

The movie, "Voyage to Paradise," has recorded the life aboard ship while at sea, arrival in Tahiti after 22 days at sea, celebrations of Tahiti with beautiful Tahitian girls dancing the tamarie, and Tahiti's neighboring island of Moorea, with its beautiful bays.

After arriving at Honolulu, Hawaii, Kellogg claimed the Hawaiian Islands as home port for the "Flying Fish."
