

Baseball League Field Lease On Park Agenda

TORRANCE — Youth baseball, which usually bats 1,000, may strike out tonight at a meeting of Park and Recreation commissioners.

Representatives of the Guenser Park Homeowners Association have asked the commission to terminate a lease held by the Babe Ruth Baseball League at Guenser Park.

They say the area is scheduled to become a public park next year, and claim scheduled baseball "is limited to a particular group . . . and would have detrimental effect on other groups desiring to use the field."

Guenser Park has been the center of controversy since a child drowned there last year in a sump.

Plans call for developing the area as a recreational park, but the Babe Ruth league has conducted programs there pending the start of construction.

Park and Recreation commissioners meet at 8 p.m. in City Hall council chambers. Other routine matters of business also are on the agenda.
