# Fall Term Brings Football Season; El Camino Squad 'Gets in Groove'

El Camino's football hopefuls took the field for the first time Sept. 1 and new head coach Ken Swearingen watched anxiously as more than 80 young men shook the earth.

Coach Swearingen's task is formidable. El Camino faces ex-Jr. Rose Bowlers Bakersfield ('61); Long Beach ('60); Santa Monica ('59); and new addition to the Metro Conference, Cerritos ('57). Not to be outdone, El Camino, Jr. Rose Bowl entrant in '54, will show a pro-type offense which features spread and slot back formations helpful in creating an open passing attack.

**DEFENSIVE PLANS**  
Defensive plans are in the hands of new coaches Vince McCullough, from Redondo High and Bill Vincent, formerly of Aviation High. Vincent has a "heavy" potential up front.
