## Local Women Pilots Direct Fall Flying

Casual dress for summer flying activities has been exchanged for more appropriate fall costumes by three local women pilots who, for the second year, are directing the flying activities and other aviation participation for the Long Beach Chapter of the Ninety-Nines, Inc., international organization of licensed women pilots.

Serving as chairman is Mrs. Robert P. Pinkney, 361 Paseo de Gracia, who announced plans for a fly-in to Modesto for the annual 99 fall sectional meeting Sept. 28 to 30. Also planning to fly their own planes are co-chairman Mrs. Robert Ross, 4738 Binkdewald, Torrance; and secretary Mrs. Ellis O. Wagner, 2516 Via la Selva, Palos Verdes Estates.

#### PARTICIPANT

Mrs. Pinkney was a participant in the recent All Woman Air Tour sponsored

by the 99's. It covered California, Nevada, and Arizona during a five-day period.

Her non-flying passenger was Mrs. T. R. Corazza of Hollywood Riviera. With her husband Robert, also a pilot, and three children, Tim, 14; Judy, 12; and baby Alice, one, Mrs. Pinkney toured California and Oregon last summer.

Mrs. Ross is an active member of the board directing the All Woman Transcontinental Air Race, now as the "Powder Puff Derby."

Her duties include the year-long preparation to verify and approve the mechanical condition of aircraft entered in a race and the responsibility for handicapping each type of aircraft entered.

Last summer Mrs. Ross flew to Oakland for the start and flew to the terminus at Wilmington, Delaware, to supervise the aircraft inspection.

Mrs. Wagner was the only local entrant in the 1962 AWTAR. She climaxed the summer flying activities by flying solo in the family airplane and placing in 16th position. 
