

Rep. Cecil King Rated Poor By Bi-partisan Study Group

Cecil King, present representative from the 17th District, this week was given the second worst rating of any California congressman by the bi-partisan Americans for Constitutional Action.

King's voting record shows only a 2 per cent score for "safeguarding the God-given dignity of the individual and promoting sound economic growth," the national organization of Democrats and Republicans revealed.

The only worse record was compiled by freshman Congressman James Corman of Van Nuys.

Kings stand on 62 key

votes from 1957 to 1961 shows "98 per cent support of a socialized economy through centralization of power," the ACA indicates.

The ACA Index is a statistical evaluation of the voting record of all senators and members of the House of Representatives.

King's "next-to-worst" voting record was compiled with stands on such issues as subsidies to Communist-dominated countries, interference with local law enforcement, federal intervention with local businesses, by-passing the Constitution and federal fixing of wage rates.
