

# North's Saxons Lose to Redondo Beach, 19-16

A touchdown in the final 25 seconds of play brought the Redondo Beach Seahawks a 19-16 victory over North High's Saxons Friday night.

North led the scoring 16-6 through the third quarter, but a last quarter surge pushed Redondo into the win column.

First to score was North's Norman Dow, who passed to Ed Estrada in the first quarter. The kick by Richard Parker left the score 7-0 at the end of the first.

In the second quarter, Parker made a field goal from the 25-yard line, netting the Saxons an extra two points. Dow ran the ball 73 yards for a near TD, but was halted short of the goal line. Cary Hubert ran it over on the next play from the 10.

Redondo's Bob Johnson ran 15 yards in the second quarter for his team's first touchdown of the game.

Hubert intercepted a wild Redondo pass from Fowler at the outset of the third quarter, and John Rance ran 30 yards to the Redondo 35. A series of first downs brought Redondo into scoring territory, and the TD came when Johnson hit


