"Africa Today" will be discussed by Wendell L. Miller, D. D., at the October general meeting of the Manhattan Beach Branch of the American Association of University Women.

Dr. Miller, pastor of the Manhattan Beach Community Church, will present a slide-lecture to the group when it convenes Monday at 7:30 p.m. at the Community Church, 303 S. Peck Ave.

The world traveler will speak on places, peoples, and problems of Africa, with particular reference to the effects of the continent's new political forces on American foreign policy and on the United Nations.

He will include references to his recent summer tour of Africa, which included Egypt, Ethiopia, Kenya, Tanganyika, South Africa and Rhodesia.

Dr. Miller visits Europe as a tour leader each summer, his past summer's itinerary having included Hungary, Bulgaria, and Rumania. He is the only member of the American Seminar to travel with it for three consecutive years. He interviewed world leaders such as England's prime minister and Marshal Tito of Yugoslavia.

RECENT TRIPS

Each year for the past several years Dr. Miller has visited Russia and the satellite countries, where he has photographed and interviewed.

He has a library of over 25,000 slides from his world journeys. He uses these in illustrated talks.
