Richard Gray and Mayo Loizeaux, the two-actor team that carries the production, will wear the double hats of writers and actors. ## Greek Theater Season Best Yet

Figures made available today establish the Tenth Anniversary Festival season of the Greek Theatre Association as the most successful, by a wide margin, in the history of the city-owned theatre.

Attendance reached 297,291, of which more than 83,000 were participants in the Program for Students and Association's Educational Teachers. The all-time high attendance figure of 256,511 reached in 1960 was exceeded this year by more than 40,000 and a 90 percent of complete capacity was attained.

Three major importations brought to Los Angeles by the Association distinguished the season with three important premieres—the full-length "A Midsummer Night's Dream" given by the New York City Ballet; the National Theatre of France, the legendary Comedie Francaise, in Moliere's "Le Bourgeois Gentilhomme;" and Sir Tyrone Guth-

Sir Tyrone's production played to absolute capacity and broke all previous records for a one week engagement in the near 100-year history of Gilbert and Sullivan.
