Sentinels Hold South to Seven

Inglewood Sentinels handed a bitter 28-7 defeat to South High Friday night in a game that left the Spartans scoreless through the final three quarters.

South got off to a roaring start, marching 75 yards in 11 plays to take a 7-0 lead with the extra point. Earl Shepherd tallied for the Spartans, bulging his way off tackle for the score.

Shepherd plowed through for the extra point.
REGAINS POISE
The Spartans held the restless Sentinels through the rest of the first quarter, but Inglewood regained its poise and became airborne in the second quarter.

Long passes thwarted the Spartan defense, and Inglewood got its first score on a 40-yard drive with Dave Rewch scoring on a dazzling 15-yard run.

Inglewood then went to the air and romped 61 yards in seven plays with the score coming on a 35-yard strike from Rocky Ash to Ron Willer. Pat Christianson kicked for the second extra point, and it was 14-7.

The Inglewood defense became impenetrable and South failed to score in the second half.

Inglewood got on the scoreboard twice more in the second half after intercepting a Spartan aerial. Inglewood went 45 yard in six plays with Jerry Argast going six yards for the score. Christianson converted to make it 21-7.
