Many Locations Set for Project

TORRANCE — An estimated 100,000 persons will receive Sabin oral vaccine in the Torrance-South Bay area as part of the SOS (Sabin-on-Sunday) campaign starting this weekend.

The prediction came today from the Los Angeles County Medical Association, which is sponsoring the series of clinics.

Teen Center Studied for Construction

TORRANCE — A unique auto repair center designed solely for teen-agers may be built here on recommendation of City Councilman Ross A. Sciarrotta.

Sciarrotta's plan envisions a garage-type facility, operated by the City of Torrance, offering youths professional guidance in automotive repair.

Assuming the proposal gains support, Sciarrotta said similar workshops could be established for youngsters interested in home repair, gardening and other related fields.

"It might be a wonderful way to keep our teen-agers off the streets, and at the same time give them valuable instruction in a vocation," said Sciarrotta.

According to the councilman, his plan is modeled after several similar programs in other parts of the nation. It has gained wide

TASTELESS VACCINE. Mothers or fathers may hold infants at the clinics, and attendants will administer the tasteless vaccine. Although the risk of polio with adults is smaller than with children, all persons have been advised to take the Sabin vaccine to avoid becoming a carrier.

A polio outbreak of epidemic proportion could occur in Southern California in the future unless the great majority of residents are immunized, Dr. K. H. Sutherland, county health officer, has warned.

Kid Mailmen Plan Blasted By Trustee

TORRANCE — Use of Torrance youngsters as mail carriers was questioned Monday by Bert Lynn, school board member, when Torrance Council PTA sought permission to send reminders to parents via students.

Mrs. Gene Hagenbaugh, representing the council, said notices would remind parents to attend a non-partisan, "meet-the-candidates" event at South High Oct. 25.

Lynn's objections, however, were over ruled by the board which voted, "because of the significance of the event to the community," to okay permission.

"I know this is important," Lynn said, "but when are people going to stop using our kids for other than teaching purposes?" He suggested the information be circulated through the 17

Woman's Suicide Try Follows Stabbing of Two

TORRANCE — A jealous wife stabbed her husband's lover to death with a pocket knife Tuesday night, then tried to murder him with the same weapon.

Police said the love triangle slaying left Clara Mae Toom, 24, dead from six stab wounds in the chest and her boyfriend, John Leonard Comeau, 40, seriously injured with knife wounds in the arms and upper body.

The wife, identified by police as Mrs. Ellen Comeau, 40, was booked on suspicion of murder in the prison ward of County General Hospital after taking sleep-

ing pills in an apparent suicide attempt, police said.

According to detectives, Mrs. Comeau learned her husband has been seeing Mrs. Toom and, in a fit of rage, burst in on her and Mrs. Toom's estranged husband in their home at 20506 Raymond St.

While Toom watched horrified, Mrs. Comeau stabbed his wife in the chest and ran from the residence. Mrs. Toom was pronounced dead on arrival at Harbor General Hospital.

Police said Mrs. Comeau then returned home with the knife and stabbed her

husband four times in the arms and upper body. He was taken to Harbor General Hospital in serious condition.

After the double-stabbing, detectives said Mrs. Comeau apparently took an overdose of sleeping pills. She was found near death at the couple's home at 23014 Carole-dale in the Carson area.

Detectives said Mrs. Toom and her husband, a milkman, were separated and Toom had been living at 149 E. 220th St.

He had visited his wife's home to make a separate-maintenance payment, officers said.
