

# Cougars Smash Spartans, 37-0

Hawthorne's Cougars had a field day as they romped over faltering South High 37-0 Friday night at El Camino.

Hawthorne bobbled the ball in early stages of the game, but then settled down and went to work.

The Cougars first of many sustained drives was 63 yards in six plays with Larry Lent hauling in a 24-yard beauty for Bill Daquila. Jerry Cass missed the extra point, and it was 6-0 Hawthorne.

Converting extra points was the only thing Hawthorne had trouble with all evening.

### OUTPLAYED

The Spartans, who were thoroughly outplayed, relinquished two more scores in the second quarter. The first of the two came on a 70-yard drive with Steve Smith plowing his way three yards through heavy traffic for the score.

Then, following an interception on the South 14, Hawthorne wasted no time as Daquila hurled 14 yards, this time to Gary Bickers for the score.

Hawthorne had its guns loaded and was ready for more in the second half — three more touchdowns.

First of the three came quickly, as the Cougars rolled up 45 yards in three plays with Pat Burris going

three yards for the tally. Cass converted for the only successful kick of the night, and it was 25-0.

### 43 YARDS

Three plays later a big Cougar tackle, Bob Bolling, got in the act and thundered 43 yards with a recovered fumble to make it 31-0. Hawthorne's last score was set up on another Cougar interception.

This time, the thief was Hawthorne's Burris. The cougars marched 68 yards in 12 plays with Don Allen scoring on a 25-yard toss from Don Ray. This drive ran out the clock with the final score 37-0 Hawthorne.
