NASCAR Championship Sees Close Race on Sunday Card

Stock car drivers, "Steady Eddie" Gray, Gardena, and San Fernando's Ron Hornaday, racing a pair of 1962 Fords owned by Galpin Motors, will be equally matched Sunday afternoon when NASCAR stages its final 100-lap Pacific Coast Championship race for late model stock cars at Ascot Park in Gardena, in their final attempt to win NASCAR's 1962 Pacific Coast Championship title.

Going into the 100-lap event, Gray and Hornaday have each earned 1272 points towards winning the coveted title, but the outcome of the race will be the deciding factor as to who will wear the crown.

Also, in contention for the 1962 Championship is Arleta's Don Noel with 1204 points. Should Gray and Hornaday fail to finish, Noel is likely to win the title, driving a '61 Ford.
