PTA Gives Show On Pornography

A program on pornography will be held Nov. 8 at Narbonne High School auditorium, 24300 S. Western Ave., according to Mrs. Howard Fults, parent education chairman for Gateway Council of Parents and Teachers.

"Obscenity is a real problem and affects children and it was therefore felt by the council that a study in action should be held to determine how big the problems in the community and what parents can do to eliminate it," Mrs. Fults said.

A question and answer period will follow the showing of two half-hour films entitled "Pages of Death," narrated by Tom Harmon, and "Perversion for Profit," narrated by George Putnam.

"These are hardcore films presenting facts; and are not pretty to see. Because of their nature no children will be allowed to attend the meeting regardless of age. No one will be admitted to the meeting after the start of the films," Mrs. Fults added.

This program is presented through citizens for Decent Literature, organization headed by Don Cortum. Dr. Cortum is a practicing physician in Torrance and is the California State chairman of the California Committee of the Citizens for Decent Literature. He and all other personnel of this organization donate their time to the project. There are no paid employees.

In addition to Dr. Cortum, there will be two other special guests at the meeting. Sylvan Smith, postmaster, of San Pedro, will attend to answer questions concerning the post office methods in dealing with obscene literature. Dwight E. Lyons, associate superintendent, Division of Educational Services for the Los Angeles City Schools, will answer questions concerning obscenity.
