



'Preparedness Training' Will Be Red Cross Topic

Preparedness training offered year round by Red Cross has received special emphasis here with scheduling of three Standard First Aid courses, two of which already are in session.

Lomita Red Cross branch, says enrollment is still open in the two courses which began Saturday at First Baptist Church, 2118 W. Carson St.

Teaching the 9 to 11 a.m. and 7 to 9 p.m. courses on five consecutive Saturdays is a Red Cross volunteer, Allen Quignon.

Mrs. Mabel Davis will teach a Standard First Aid course scheduled on five consecutive Mondays, beginning Nov. 12 from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. at Riviera Methodist Church, 375 Palos Verdes Blvd.

Others of the more than 20 Standard First Aid course on the Red Cross chapter's schedule this month include a course beginning Nov. 8 to be taught from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. at Southern regional headquarters, 390 W. 7th St., San Pedro.

A course also will begin

at South Bay Red Cross office, 109 Emerald, Redondo Beach, on Nov. 12 with classes slated for 7 to 9 p.m.

An Advanced First Aid course, one of the three being offered throughout the Los Angeles area this month, began last Monday at the South Bay Christian Church, 5922 Pacific Coast Highway, Redondo Beach. This 16 hour course will be offered from 9 a.m. to noon on consecutive Mondays.

West says all Red Cross courses are free and open to the public. Registration is permitted through the second session and may be made at the class.

Students should bring a piece of cloth for bandaging which is at least six inches wide and 36 inches long and 75 cents to cover the charge made for the textbook.

'Y' Breakfast Plans Proceed On Schedule; Set Saturday

Dr. Rollin R. Smith, chairman of Torrance YMCA's 15th annual Good Neighbor Breakfast, says advance preparations for the huge meal are "all on schedule."

More than 200 persons are working to make the biggest and oldest community breakfast a success for another year, Smith says.

Posters are being constructed by the Aces Gra-Y Club; billboards are being painted by Michael Murphy; prizes are being obtained by the YMCA Board under leadership of Earl Brugman; decorations and floral arrangements are being handled by Mrs. Henry Iwai; entertainment is being recruited by Clifton Duncan and Betty Thomas; and, the cooks, dishwashers and wait-

resses are being recruited from the Hi-Y, Tri-Hi-Y and Phalanx Clubs of the YMCA.

In addition, Smith is gathering 300 pounds of flapjack flour; 80 gallons of orange juice; 300 pounds of sausage links; 50 pounds of coffee; and, 40 gallons of maple syrup.

On Friday of last week, a small army of YMCA boys and girls began selling tickets for the gigantic affair in a contest to win a number of prizes and to bring a crowd of at least 4,700 people to the YMCA.

According to Smith, that's the number who were served last year, and each year's throng grows larger!

The annual charity event is scheduled Saturday, from 6:30 until 11:30 a.m. in the YMCA.
