City Gets Share Of License Fees

Torrance has received \$23,410 as its six-month share of the fees paid by holders of alcoholic beverage licenses.

The payment was made by the state department of alcoholic beverage control which allocated 90 per cent of all license fee money back to individual cities and counties to be used for the many branches of services offered by local governments. The remaining 10 per cent goes into the state general fund.

The most recent payment was for the six-month period ending Aug. 31, 1962. Los Angeles County as a whole, including unincorporated areas, received \$1,810,263 for the period.
