


Family Wins Color Video

Noted Autor To Highlight Lecture Series

Scott O'Dell, 1961 Newbery award winner for the book *Island of the Blue Dolphins*, will speak to Torrance teachers at 4 p.m. Thursday at Hamilton Elementary School, highlighting a series of Literature Institutes offered by the Torrance School District this year.

Previously O'Dell, a newspaperman, book reviewer and authority on California history, has written books for adults.

His Newbery award winner is his first book for children.

He knew his story, based upon the "Lost Woman of San Nicholas Island" whom Scott O'Dell named Karana, would have its impact on older readers, but also, if told simply, as Karana herself might have told it, would have strong appeal for readers as young as Karana was, when her story began.

O'Dell lives with his wife, Dorsa, at Stoneapple Farm, which lies in an upland meadow among pear, peach and apple orchards. Their field stone house is located near Julian, Calif., a gold-mining town of the 1880's.

This institute, featuring National Children's Book Week, Nov. 11 to 17, will be followed by another institute, Dec. 13, presenting the noted Caldecott Award Winner, Leo Politi.


WORKERS RIDE


WHAT'S DOING
