Youth Leader to Guide Activities at Temple

Steven Leichter has been elected first director of youth activities for Temple Menorah of the South Bay. Temple Menorah, located at 1101 Camino Real, Redondo Beach, serves persons of the Jewish faith in the South Bay - Peninsula - Centinella areas.

Two youth groups are associated with the congregation. Temple Menorah Juniors is for Jewish children 12 to 15 years of age and Menorah Federation of Temple Youth, is for young people ages 15 to 18.

M.F.T.Y. is associated with Southern California Federation of Temple Youth, the regional body representing 37 Reform Jewish Congregations in Southern California. Both M.F.T.Y. and T.M.J. are affiliates of the National Federation of Temple Youth whose national headquarters is in the House of Living Judaism, 838 Fifth Ave., New York City.

This is headquarters of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, parent body of all Reform congregations and of Temple Menorah.

Leichter is a graduate of the Glendale Public School System and attends Glendale College. Former president of his own temple youth group, Glen-Teens of Temple Sinai of Glendale, he is a past president of S.C.F.H.Y. and was first vice president of the Los Angeles Jewish Youth Council, which represents all Jewish youth movements of Southern California.

Last year Leichter was chosen as one of 50 young persons from the United States to study in Israel at the Institute For Youth Leaders From Abroad. The Institute was represented by some 130 youths from all over the world. Purpose of the Institute is to train youth leaders to return to their own groups around the world with a better understanding of Judaism and

Israel. The Institute is under the sponsorship of the Jewish Agency.

During his year in Israel Leichter spent six months in study in Jerusalem learning the Hebrew language and touring the Biblical and archeological sites in that new State in the Holy Land. The next six months he spent in a "Kibbutz" and a "Moshav," two types of farm villages.

Mesmerism To Be Topic Of Sermon

Need for spiritual vigilance will be stressed at Christian Science church services this Sunday.

Keynoting the lesson-sermon entitled "Ancient and Modern Necromancy, alias Mesmerism and Hypnotism, Denounced" is the Kolden Text from Romans: "If God be for us, who can be against us?"

One of the citations to be read from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy states (p. 324):

"Be watchful, sober, and vigilant. The way is straight and narrow, which leads to the understanding that God is the only Life. It is a warfare with the flesh, in which we must conquer sin, sickness, and death, either here or hereafter. — certainly before we can reach the goal of Spirit, or life in God."

Christian Lecturer Stresses Man's Need of Awareness

Awareness of man's God-given dominion is the great need of mankind. John D. Pickett of Chicago told a large audience in Torrance, Monday evening.

Mr. Pickett held that the basis of demonstrating this dominion is spiritual understanding of God and of man as the expression of God.

"With this understanding comes the spiritual capacity to overcome ungodlike beliefs of fear, sin, sickness, and other destructive forces," he declared.

A well-traveled member of The Christian Science Board of Lectureship, Mr. Pickett spoke in the church edifice at 218th St. and Manuel Ave. under the auspices of First Church of Christ, Scientist, Torrance. He was introduced by Scott Albright, first reader.

In his lecture entitled "Christian Science: The Unfailing Power of God Made Practical," Mr. Pickett emphasized that God's law of healing, as taught and prac-

ticed by Christ Jesus, is universal and available to everyone.

"There are two basic footsteps demanded of us," he said, "if we are to make practical in our lives the power of God to solve the problems of the present age. One: to gain the spiritual understanding of God. Two: to have the correct view of man made in the image of God."

Mr. Pickett explained that prayer as understood in Christian Science is spiritual knowing that man is not motivated by anything less than divine Love.

In discussing the nature of law, the lecturer pointed out that law covers both rights and responsibilities.

"One who knows the nature of law only in part," he said, "is often heard to say, 'I know my rights.' But the mature citizen also knows his responsibilities. In Science it is knowing our divine rights and accepting our spiritual responsibilities that fulfills the law."

Mr. Pickett maintained that God, divine Love, cannot be understood through the material senses.

"Our impression of Him," he declared, "must come through spiritually enlightened consciousness, because God is Spirit and His nature is composed of spiritual qualities alone. Also, God is Love; and divine Love never fails. The fulfilling of the law of Love is our heritage to prove. The love derived from God is a quality re-

flected in the pure consciousness of man, and it carries divine Love's unfailing power."

This power is ever available to bring dominion over accidents, he stated.

"Accidents are unknown to God, or immortal Mind, and we must leave the moral basis of belief and unite with the one Mind, in order to change the notion of chance to the proper sense of God's unerring direction and thus bring out harmony," he said, quoting from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy.

It is not necessary to curtail activities in business or sports to gain protection from accidents, Mr. Pickett said. "On the contrary," he declared, "we have only to acknowledge and understand that the one Mind, God, governs all activity in order to eliminate accidents from our experiences."

He emphasized that everyone can be free from fear, frustration, and failure through spiritual means alone.

"We find salvation," he said, "by looking beyond the fable to the fact, beyond the mechanistic to the spiritual, beyond the mortal to the immortal. Divine Principle enables one to go straight to the right choice and stick to it. Thus we find salvation. We feel divine Love's ever-presence, whose gentle impulsion unfailingly imparts healing and gives action to all true thought."


Looking very much like little dolls themselves, the Cardinal's special guests will arrive by bus or private cars. Directed by the Sisters, they will wind their way down the terraces to
