Interest Hiked At Cabrillo, Officials Say

Cabrillo Savings has boosted the interest paid on savings accounts to 4.80 per cent effective Jan. 1, it is announced by Pietro di Carlo, president and board chairman of the local association.

The new rate is the highest paid on insured savings, and together with Cabrillo's policy of paying "instant interest" (from the date funds are received), it assures savers of the maximum return available on fully-protected accounts. Interest will be compounded four times yearly.

An increase of over 140 per cent in assets for Cabrillo Savings is reported by Fred Strohmeier, executive vice president and manager. Assets are now over \$6,100,000 compared with the total of \$2,540,000 at the end of 1961.


