## Churches to File Tax Returns in March

Church and veteran tax exemptions may not be filed in any office of the County Assessor before the first Monday in March, according to a statement issued today by County Assessor Philip E. Watson.

"This is in accordance with Section 255 of the Revenue and Taxation Code," stated Assessor Watson. "New claim forms are now being prepared and its is expected that henceforth most exemptions will be claimed by mail.

Veterans who have filed previously and who do not own real estate will be sent claim forms upon request.

Veterans filing for the first time must appear in person at an Assessor's Office and present satisfactory evidence of qualifying service in the Armed Forces of the United States.

"Thus, ample opportunity will be afforded all taxpayers affected to claim exemptions within statutory time limitations, either by mail or personally at one of the Assessor's permanent or temporary branch offices located throughout Los Angeles County, or at the Main Office in the Hall of Administration, 500 West Temple

Street, Los Angeles," concluded Assessor Watson.


