

Little League Signs Boys On Saturday

The North Torrance Little League East will sign up for baseball next Saturday, Jan. 26 from ten in the morning until two in the afternoon at McMasters Park, 3624 W. 174th St., Torrance.

Any boy is eligible who will be eight by August 1, but not yet 13. Each boy must be accompanied by a parent and bring proof of birth.

North Torrance Little League East boundaries are Redondo Beach Blvd. on the north, 190th St. on the south, Glenburn and Falda Aves. to the west and Western Ave. to the east. Boys do not have to know how to play to sign, they will learn under guidance of coaches and managers, according to John Mangiagli, president of the Little League group.

The Torrance American Little League will register boys for the 1963 season, Saturday, Jan. 26, from 8:30 a.m. until 1 p.m., at Seaside ballpark at the west end of Sharynne Lane.

In case of rain, it will take place in Calle Mayor School.

All boys, including last year's majors, must register again. Registration donation is \$3 per family, and one of the parents must sign for each boy.

Boys within the Torrance American League boundaries born on or after Aug. 1, 1950, and on or before July 31, 1955, are eligible provided they meet other regulations.

A birth certificate or a certified copy will be the only acceptable document for registration, but other age documents can be used until a birth certificate can be obtained.

The boundaries are Sepulveda Blvd. on the north, Hawthorne Blvd. on the east, Pacific Coast Hwy. on the south, to the Torrance city boundary on the west.

A general meeting will be held Wednesday evening, Feb. 6, at 7:30 to give dates of tryouts, and other information.

The school is located two blocks north of Sepulveda between Anza and Palos Verdes Blvds. A general meeting of the league and registration will begin at 7:30 p.m.

All boys 13 and 14 years of age are eligible to play Pony league ball. Boys who played ball last season must also register again this year, according to Stanley Sellers.

Both parents, he said, must appear with the boy and sign the registration card, as well as bring along a birth certificate to verify age. A registration fee of \$5 will be required to cover cost of insurance, uniforms, and field maintenance.

The league boundaries are Prospect Ave., on the west; Del Amo Blvd. on the north; east along Del Amo to Madrona, south on Madrona to Sepulveda, east on Sepulveda to Crenshaw Blvd., south on Crenshaw to Pacific Coast Highway, and west on Pacific Coast to Prospect Ave.
