A former employee of the Federal Bureau of the Budget in Washington, D.C., and the Bonneville Power Administration in Portland, Oregon, he is vice-chancellor of business affairs at California State Colleges.

From 1954 to 1956 Richardson lived in Burma where, under the auspices of the Ford Foundation, he served as management consultant to the Burmese government. During the period 1959-1961 he traveled extensively in Asia while serving as Director of Administration for the Asia Foundation.
