

**Mrs. Rodson Heads Fight On Cancer**

Mrs. L. A. Rodson, newly-appointed section crusade chairman for the American Cancer Society in the West Torrance area, joined other volunteers for a briefing on the leukemia research project of Dr. Robert McAllister, associate professor of pediatrics at the University of Southern California.

The project, to study the effect of various immune serums on human leukemia cells, is being conducted under an American Cancer Society grant at Children's hospital in Los Angeles.

"More children under 15 years of age die of cancer than from any other cause," Mrs. Rodson reported.

"These children are the main reason I have undertaken the job of volunteer residential chairman. The American Cancer Society is underwriting by far the largest amount of privately financed leukemia research in the country today, with more than \$2 million grants in effect on this one type of cancer alone," she said.

Mrs. Rodson will be responsible for enlisting the help of more than 50 volunteers between now and the annual April Crusade.

**Ski School On Tuesdays**

What is Exploring? What is an Explorer? Do you know? We hope we can help you to understand the Exploring program.

The Exploring program has been carefully designed to meet the needs and desires of high-school age boys.

The program is based on methods found effective during a half-century of dealing with American youth and on further information about high-school age boys.

The Exploring program embodies the objective of the Boy Scouts of America in building character, training for citizenship, and developing physical fitness among boys.

This program is distinctly for fellows of high school age. It will be attractive to ever have been a Cub Scout or Boy Scout.

Young men at least fourteen years of age and in the ninth grade or higher are eligible to be Explorers (membership is open at fifteen years of age regardless of grade).

Membership may continue by annual reregistration through the age of seventeen, or as long as the individual continues as a full-time student in high school.

Exploring is a program of action, doing a wide variety of activities that interest the majority of most members. Exploring offers clean adventurous outdoor activities; the company of other fellows and girls at parties, picnics, or other social affairs; an opportunity to explore various vocations and to develop hobby interests; a chance to develop personal fitness and to do something about citizenship responsibilities.

One feature of the Exploring program is the emphasis on post specialties. There are some posts known for their interest in emergency service, others for science. Some are radio hams, others are wilderness campers. This concentration may go on for several months or years and then change to another specialty or to none at all.

Actually the specialty becomes a center of interest around which general Explorer activities are planned.

This is only some of the parts of Exploring, investigate today and find out the others.
