The most difficult of the Five Truths of the Declaration of Independence for men to accept is the First: "That all men are created equal."

Stephen Douglas, in his debates with Abraham Lincoln—that great upholder of the Declaration of Independence—spoke at great length on the absurdity of the equality of man.

Mr. Lincoln replied that the issue of which they spoke was "part of the eternal struggle between right and wrong which will go on long after these poor clanking tongues of Judge Douglas and I are silent."

Mr. Lincoln was right. The debate on the equality of man still goes on, and will continue as long as men live on earth.
