Harvey Tells Of 'New New' Indy Racer

The question of four or five cars carrying the Harvey Aluminum tanner at Indianapolis next month has been answered. Company president Lawrence A. Harvey and car builder Mickey Thompson disclosed that there will be a five-car factory team at the Speedway.

"We can't keep it under wraps any longer," said Harvey. "The 'new new' car will be a titanium special featuring extensive development applications of this lightweight space metal produced by us."

The titanium rear-engine racer will be equipped with 12-inch wheels and the wide tread tires developed by Firestone and Thompson. "Weight and technical details are not available at this time," said Thompson, "but the powerplant will be the same as the other cars, an aluminum V-8 engine. The whole project for this car is as secret as we can keep it."

A driver was not announced for the titanium car, which is nearing completion. Harvey Aluminum of Torrance is a primary producer of aluminum, titanium, zirconium, steel alloys, and special metals.
