


A MESSAGE TO

Palsy Drive Starts Wed.

A goal of \$350,000 was announced today for United Cerebral Palsy Association's annual appeal for funds which starts Wednesday, May 1 in Los Angeles County.

Contributions will be used to support services for children and adults suffering from cerebral palsy, a condition caused by damage to motor areas of the brain.

Services maintained by United Cerebral Palsy Association in Los Angeles County include four pre-school nurseries, three development centers for children ineligible for public school programs, an industrial training workshop, vocational counseling and guidance.

There are waiting lists at United Cerebral Palsy facilities and many of the youngsters suffer multiple handicaps such as sight, speech, and hearing in addition to muscular disorders.
