

Torrance Firemen Invite Public to Visit Stations

In recognition of the valiant efforts of the fire fighters of California, Saturday, May 4, 1963, has been designated as "Fire Service Day." The Torrance Fire Department will join the statewide observation of "Fire Service Day" by holding an open house at all Torrance Fire Stations from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. During this time, the public is cordially invited to tour the fire stations located at 1701 Crenshaw Boulevard (Headquarters Station, Carson and Crenshaw), 2900 block Pacific Coast Highway, Waveria; 3610 174th St., North Torrance and 5205 Calle Mayor, Hollywood Riviera; and view the equipment on display.

At Headquarters Station at 2 p.m., a demonstration of aerial ladder work, rescue practices, hose laying and net jumping will be held. Mouth-to-mouth breathing and closed chest cardiac massage will be demonstrated throughout the day.

It is requested that parents accompany their children as no children under twelve years of age will be permitted unless accompanied by an adult. Visitors will be allowed to photograph equipment and personnel whenever practicable.

Torrance YM Records Fall At 7th Annual Track Meet

Hundreds of YMCA boys and their parents came to Narbonne High School last Saturday for the seventh annual Gra-Y and Jr. Hi-Y track meets.

Many Torrance YMCA records fell during the day of races and field events. Champions among the Y Clubs serving boys nine to twelve years of age were the Jaguars, with 34½ points, followed closely by the Vikings, with 32½ points. The Big Horns placed third, and the Mustangs followed in fourth place among sixteen Gra-Y Clubs in competition.
