## WHITE HORSE CELLAR AWARD

One of the most cherished awards in the Restaurant-Hospitality field has come to the Hunting Horn Restaurant, Peninsula Center, Hawthorne at Silver Spur Roads.

It is the famed White Horse Cellar award which was presented Thursday, April 25, by the British Government on behalf of Brown-Vintner Co., a subsidiary of the House of Seagrams in the United States.

Mr. Bruce Powell, British vice-consul in Los Angeles, made the presentation to Mr. and Mrs. Jack Hesnault and Mr. Ted Strangeman, co-owners of the Hunting Horn, at a cocktail party in the Tap room of the restaurant.

Mr. Powell is the vice-consul for British affairs. The award consists of a plaque and an authentic reproduction of the original White Horse Cellar Inn which was a famous landmark in Edinburgh, Scotland in the 18th Century period. This cellar was a favorite of the celebrated and the aristocratic people of the British Isles and was frequented by Robert Burns and other famous citizens of the day. It was an 8-day ride from London by stage or horseback.
