Kent Anderson Wins Award For Job Safety

Kent Anderson, 4215 W. 173rd St., Torrance, a construction superintendent with Ernest W. Hahn, Inc., general contractors, won third place in a job safety competition during 1962. Anderson received a \$25 U.S. Savings Bond for having the best safety record for Hahn superintendents on jobs in the \$200,000 to \$600,000 category.

He was one of nine men singled out for outstanding safety records during the past year by Laven Insurance, Inc., of Hawthorne, Hahn's insurance carrier.

In addition, 100 employees who were without accident for the entire year were given inscribed lighters.

This is the first year that Laven has made the awards to Hahn employees. Hahn is one of Southern California's largest builders of supermarkets, drug stores, shopping centers and other commercial buildings.

School Bonds

A syndicate headed by Security First National Bank was awarded \$1,000,000 in Torrance Unified School District bonds with a winning bid of 2.938 per cent.

The issue, to mature over a 20-year period, will be offered at prices yielding 1.70 per cent in 1964 to 3.15 per cent in 1983. Coupons include 4s, 2 1/2s, 2 3/4s and 3s.

Other members of the syndicate include Wells Fargo Bank, Blyth & Co. Inc., R. H. Moulton & Company and William R. Staats & Co.

Crossing Bill

Proponents of legislation to shift the cost of school crossing guards from cities to school districts are experiencing some difficulty in the Legislature.

Two measures, Senate Bill 98 and 101 have been referred back to or held in committee.

The California Teachers Association opposes both measures on the basis that traffic control is a municipal or county function and that conflicts over jurisdiction could result from passage of the bills.
