Tardondo 7-Up Yankees Nip Dodgers, Trim White Sox

The Tardondo 7-Up Yankees, still short of players due to injuries, showed their fighting spirit by beating the Elwood Nursery Dodgers, 2-1, then squaring accounts with the Anchor Mortgage White Sox via a 6-4 victory. Against the Dodgers, the Yankee sparkplug and slugger, Deenie Gibson, pitched one hit ball, and scored the first Yankee run with a home run blast.

The lone hit of the Dodgers was by Bobby Hibbard. The lone run was via walks. The winning run was driven in by a jubilant Gary Palmer, who scored Alan Marshall, who singled and went to second on a passed ball. Gibson had 15 strikeouts to his credit. His catcher, Palmer, was a recruit to the job. The Dodger battery, good enough to win most games except this one was George Sharp pitching and Mike Mannion and Matty Letteriello catching. In the Yankee victory against the White Sox, the same pitchers faced each other again, this time Robbie Nelson getting the win over Bob Hornaday. In this game Deenie Gibson put two over the fence, one home run accounting for three runs. Alan Marshall accounted for two other Yankee hits and one RBI. Leigh Thomas was the White Sox catcher, and Bruce Netherly the Yankee catcher. Nelson got some important strikeouts with men on base and the best White Sox slugger at bat, and also got clutch fielding from his team. The White Sox were also on the short end of an eight-inning overtime shutout against the Marina Federal Savings Tigers. The final score was 5-0.
