FRANK MAJOR WILL STUDY ON SCIENCE UNIT GRANT

Frank R. Major, El Camino College zoology instructor, will study in Charleston, Ore., this summer as a recipient of a National Science Foundation award.

The grant is offered by the NSF at Oregon Institute of Marine Biology at Charleston. The study will open on June 17 and close August 10, during which time courses in marine biology will be conducted.

Participation for the summer institute is open only to teachers of biological sciences in universities, colleges and junior colleges.

Stipends and allowances will be given 25 participants. Awards were offered on the basis of scholarship, indicated success in biology teaching and apparent need for experience in marine biology.

The program consists of a specially designed course, "Biology of Marine Organisms," meeting five days each week. The course will cover taxonomic, morphological, ecological, and physiological

aspects of marine zoology and botany. The lectures will include two series, one presented by an invertebrate zoologist and one by an algalologist. Such subjects as intertidal zonation, productivity, and community structure will be integrated.

An introduction by oceanographers to physical and chemical environment will also be outlined. Several distinguished visitors will present weekly seminars on specialized topics.

Organized field trips to various habitats of the open coast, estuaries, mud flats, and off-shore stations will also be features of the extensive summer program. Time will be allowed for laboratory examination of specimens and participants will be encouraged to pursue individual research projects during unscheduled time.

Major will experience advanced study with representatives of leading biological departments throughout the Western Hemisphere.


