



## New Office Edifice Cited

McBride and Mason's new office building at 713 S. Pacific Coast Hwy., Redondo Beach, last week was presented with Southern California Edison Company's "Award for Electrical Excellence."  
Edison district manager Lew Jenkins made the presentation to developer Al McBride and architect Earl Mason, A.I.A.  
The award was recently established to recognize built-in electrical quality in commercial and professional buildings, just as the Medalion Home Award is the electric industry's honor in residential construction, Jenkins said.  
The modern two-story office building contains nine offices and a total of 4,300 square feet. Each office is "climate controlled" by electric heat pumps, the weather-making machines that alternately warm and cool rooms through reverse cycling, Jenkins pointed out.  
The building also met the highest standards for lighting and electrical water heating, he said.  
The building is of contemporary design and achieves an inviting appearance through attractive landscaping and a multi-colored facade, Jenkins added.


