TEEN-AGE JAZZ GROUP KNOCKS AT FAME'S DOOR IN BOWL SHOW

And Torrance teenagers Norman Britton, Mary Jane Collins and Nancy Baker are out to make certain the door is opened when they appear in the Hollywood Bowl finals of the Fourth Annual Battle of the Bands Friday, June 28, at 8:30 p.m.

Members of the South High School jazz dance ensemble, Miss Collins, who resides at 23508 Susana Ave., and Miss Baker, of 5338 Carol Drive, will appear in special production numbers featured in the Bowl presentation of recent winners of preliminaries conducted throughout the county. More than 1000 of the southland's most talented young musicians competed in the six months leading to the Bowl finals.

AIMS AT DIPLOMACY
Miss Baker, South High's commissioner of public relations, a member of the Order of Athena and California Scholarship Society, hopes to continue her education and carve out a ca-

reer in the foreign service. She is 16 years old.

Coed Mary Jane Collins, secretary of the South High junior class, finds time for both student body and cultural activities. She is a member of the student body's governing council, the French Club, and appears in all of the modern jazz ensemble's production. The 16-year-old dancer hopes to become a secretary eventually.

Britton, who lives at 2627 W. 226th St., also plays alto sax with the Continental Jazz Quintet, one of three groups competing in the combo division in the Bowl finals. The quint recently gained recognition for appearances in the El Camino Jazz Festival, where they won first place, and at the Lighthouse.

TO STUDY MUSIC
Britton, president of the South High Jazz Club, is a member of the American Jazz Society. Now in his junior year at South, the 17-year-old musician will study music and business

administration in college.
