

\$17 Million Storm Drain Facilities, Projects Done

Nearly \$17 million in new storm drain facilities have been completed in the fourth supervisorial district as part of the \$225 million bond issue program of 1958, Supervisor Burton W. Chace disclosed today.

A total of 22 entire projects and nine supporting

projects have been finished under supervision of county flood control district chief engineer M. E. Salisbury. Chace said the first project was placed in construction during the summer of 1959.

Approximately \$5.4 million in drainage projects are

currently being built in the fourth district, including six complete systems and one partial project.

Chace listed the following communities which will benefit from work already done or currently under way:

Ver City, El Segundo, Long Beach, West Los Angeles, Lynwood, Manhattan Beach, Palms, Palos Verdes, Redondo Beach, Rolling Hills, San Pedro, Santa Monica, South Gate, Westchester and Playa del Rey.

Project design is handled by Torrance, Compton, Cul-

located or by the county engineer for unincorporated areas. Flood control district personnel oversee construction and are responsible for operation and maintenance upon completion.

Chace said all the drains are constructed by private contractors on a competitive bid basis.

Golf Course Plans Approved

Final plans and specifications for construction of Los Verdes golf course facilities on Palos Verdes Peninsula were approved today by the board of supervisors.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace said the plans, prepared by the architectural firm of Arthur Froehlich & Associates, indicate a con-

struction cost of \$513,278. The project, to be financed by board of retirement funds, would provide for a clubhouse building and facilities including a dining hall, banquet room, pro shop, locker rooms, lounge, offices and coffee shop. Construction time is estimated at 270 calendar days.

'Let's Do More in '64' Is Theme of GOP Corps
