

FREE CLINICS SET HERE IN GOLF, TENNIS

Golf clinics will be held from July 1 to July 5 at Carson High from 2 to 4:30 p.m. and at Narbonne High from 5 to 7:30 p.m.

Tennis clinics will be held from Aug. 12 to 16 at Carson High, from 2 to 4:30 p.m., and the same dates at Narbonne High from 5 to 7:30 p.m.

The golf and tennis instruction will be for both students and adults and will be free. The clinics are sponsored by the youth services section of the Los Angeles city schools.

Carl Branner, special events director for the youth services section, says the golf and tennis clinics are designed to acquaint participants with the rules, strategy and etiquette of each sport. Ten hours of instruction, with 2-hour sessions Monday through Friday, are available at each location.

Bill Corwin, coordinator of the clinics, stressed that the program is free and that all equipment will be furnished by youth services.

Corwin will conduct the golf instruction along with Ken Griffin, instructor at Los Angeles City College. Mr. and Mrs. Dale Rohland will conduct the tennis clinics.
