Hahn Praises Economy In Building New Men's Jail

Strict economy in building a new county men's jail near the L.A. Civic Center was reported today by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Four architects working in a joint venture reported to supervisors that the jail is now finished and ready for furnishing.

Hahn noted the facility was completed at a cost of approximately \$4,270 per inmate. At hearings on the project several years ago, he demanded that the construction cost be kept at a minimum.

At that time, the engineer's estimate for the five-story jail topped \$7,500 per inmate.

"That's too fancy for a jail," Hahn said. "I think the cost should be held as close to \$4,000 per inmate as possible."

The supervisor today com-

mended the architects for their economical planning, which resulted in the facility being built for approximately \$14.2 million, about \$2.5 million less than the amount budgeted for the job.

Working together in the architectural venture were Albert C. Martin and Associates, Kenneth S. Wing, William Allen, and Charles Luckman Associates.

The jail can accommodate 3,323 inmates and is a reinforced concrete structure enclosing 585,150 square feet in floor area.

Four mess halls, a chapel, and an infirmary are included with the cell blocks.

The jail is situated at 441 Baughman St., Los Angeles.

Harvey Aluminum Increases Prices

Harvey Aluminum, Inc., primary producer and major extruder of aluminum, increased prices one cent a pound on aluminum extruded rod, bar, and shapes in alloy 6063. The increase, effective July 8, did not change the pricing structure for quantity, packaging, and other differentials, the company said.

"The upward adjustment of soft alloy extrusions reflects a closer appreciation of the cost of extruding aluminum related to the price of aluminum ingot and was long overdue," said a Harvey spokesman.

Alloy 6063 extrusions have wide usage in such building products as windows, doors, thresholds, store fronts, and curtain walls as well as in volume consumer durable goods.

The increase restores prices to a more realistic level in keeping with sound economic dictates, the company said. Furthermore, marketing factors indicate that the move will not cut back the current upsurge in demand for aluminum, said the company.


