Then there's one-armed Allen Heath of Northridge, with three Ascot wins; Close on his heels is husky Dee Jones of Phoenix, Tiger Gene Brown, also of Phoenix, Ray Douglas, Hal Minyard, Donnie Melton, Paul Jones (Parnelli's brother) of Torrance, Phil Bradley of Gardena, motorcycle champ Don Hawley, Stan McElrath and a field of more than 40.

The weekly program, unless specifically changed, will consist of the traditional 3-lap trophy dash, four 6-lap heat races, consolation go, 15-lap semi-main and the 30-lap finale.

Gas Company Pays \$266,997 Taxes in City

Torrance residents benefited from \$266,997 in ad valorem and other taxes paid by the Southern California Gas Co., the utility reports.

Education received the largest sum, a total of \$114,279, with the city of Torrance obtaining \$86,994, according to G. M. Babbie, manager of the firm's southwest division which headquarters in Inglewood. The city incomes were from franchise, ad valorem and business license levies.

Torrance's allocation is part of nearly \$135 million which went to Los Angeles County's cities, schools, special districts and for use by the county, Babbie pointed out. He noted that education received \$5,298,374 of the gas company's payment.

Southern California Gas Co. spent \$43 million in all taxes last year. Nearly one-half of the amount was paid to support Southland communities and counties, Babbie concluded.




