

GI's Widow Helped to Get 3 Pensions

The total of 100,000 widows of wartime U.S. servicemen who have never applied for pensions due them has been dramatically reduced by at least one, according to Loren M. Heft, Centinela-South Bay counselor on the staff of county service officer Arthur H. Tryon.

A resident of an unincorporated area of the county, the widow came to the attention of welfare authorities when a condition of melancholia made it necessary for her to be removed from her lodgings to a sanitarium. She was without visible resources.

In writing up her case history, a staff member deducted that some member of the patient's family had been in the military service.

Routine investigation by the county service officer's department bared the fact that the subject was entitled to a pension as the unmarried widow of a veteran who died subsequent to service in World War II.

Further search disclosed that one of her sons was killed in a wartime accident at March Air Force Base and the other was aboard an aircraft unreported after leaving Newfoundland on a combat mission. In each of the latter cases the patient was construed to be a dependent parent.

Several cases provide such conspicuous example of extreme need and timely fulfillment, Heft reported. However, the county service officer will gladly entertain any bona fide claim by a veteran or a veteran's survivor.

City's License Fee Share Is \$136,000

City and county treasuries throughout the State shared in an apportionment of \$32,114,994 as their final allocation of motor vehicle license fee revenues for the six-month period which ended May 31.

Assemblyman Clayton A. Dills said he has been informed by state controller Alan Cranston that Los Angeles county's share was \$6,169,516. Cities within his area received the following

amounts: Torrance, \$136,001; Gardena, \$47,832; Hawthorne, \$45,128; Lawndale, \$28,199, and Redondo Beach, \$59,611.

Cranston said the third and final apportionment brought to \$135,953,384 the total amount distributed to cities and counties from this source during the 1962-63 fiscal year, compared with \$123,578,653 the year before.

The money is allocated on a population basis, half the

total going to the cities and half to the counties. The recent allocation amounted to \$5.45 for each city resident and \$4.32 for each county resident.

Population of cities, based on Department of Finance estimates, was fixed at 12,504,683, an increase of 539,945 from last year. By law the 1960 federal census figure of 15,717,204 was used for the counties' computation.

The controller explained that the fees, because they take the place of a property tax on vehicles, may be used by the cities and counties for general purposes.




