

Top School Post in L.A. Goes to Torrance Resident

George E. McMullen of 23725 Eshelman has been appointed coordinator of special educational programs for the Los Angeles city schools, superintendent Jack P. Crowther announced.

McMullen, who has been a teacher and consultant in the Los Angeles school district for 11 years, will assume his new duties immediately, Crowther stated.

In his new assignment, McMullen will serve as a staff advisor to the superintendent screening, planning and developing new educational programs for special projects for the Los Angeles city schools.

He will also coordinate efforts of the Los Angeles school district in developing joint projects with outside

agencies such as the California State Department of Education, universities, foundations and other governmental offices.

McMullen, 37, is a graduate of Santa Barbara High School, received a Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of California, Santa Barbara, and a masters' degree from the University of Southern California.

He started with the Los Angeles school district as a teacher at San Pedro High School and later taught at University High School and Wilmington Junior-High. He has been a special projects consultant for the district since August, 1961.

From 1957 to 1960 he served as superintendent of the Etna Union High School District in Northern California.

Water Replenishment Zone In West Basin Is Mapped

Procedures are in motion toward re-establishment of the special water replenishment zone in the west basin of the county, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said today.

The board of supervisors has directed the county counsel to prepare resolutions calling for the zone's adoption and setting procedures for a public hearing.

All or portions of the following cities are included in the zone:

Torrance, El Segundo, Gardena, Hawthorne, Hermosa Beach, Inglewood, Lawndale, a minor portion of Long Beach and Los Angeles, Manhattan Beach, Palos Verdes Estates, Redondo Beach, Rolling Hills and Rolling Hills Estates. Some unincorporated county territory is also included.

Five-Cent Levy

Established in 1954, the zone was continued for another five year period in 1959 and the new action seeks to extend it through 1967, Hahn said.

A five-cent tax per \$100 is levied within the zone to finance projects under the Flood Control District's water conservation program.

Highlight of the report deals with the proposed design and construction of the Dominguez Gap barrier project and indicates water to maintain the barrier will be purchased by the Central and West Basin Water Replenishment District.

It will be aimed at pre-

venting further brine intrusion into the West Coast Basin from the San Pedro Bay areas, Hahn said.

Hahn said sea intrusion into the West Coast Basin from San Pedro Bay has extended over an area of approximately 29 square miles, pointing up the necessity for constructing the Dominguez Gap project to complement a similar barrier now being built on the west side of the county.

Proposed Barrier

Proposed routing of the Dominguez barrier would run from the Metropolitan Water District middle feeder from a connection in the vicinity of 223rd street and Alameda Street. The barrier would lie along Dominguez Channel from a point just south of Sepulveda Boulevard and run south to the vicinity of Anaheim Street, southwest to Alameda and "F" streets, and west in "F" to a point just west of Figueroa.
