Pan American Dive Star Enters Invitational Meet

Pan American champion and U.S. Women's National Platform Champion, Linda Cooper, is the latest entry for the Fifth Annual Los Angeles Invitational Swimming and Diving Meet, July 25, 26, 27, 28 at the Los Angeles Swim Stadium.

Jack Roth, U.S. Pan American diving coach says, Miss Cooper, though not yet 20, could be the best in the world, if she isn't so already. She's almost certain to be on the U.S. Olympic team that will compete in Tokyo in 1964.

This will be Miss Cooper's last California appearance as she leaves for North Carolina right after this meet to defend her U.S. title.

In addition to the diving champion, 18 other members of the 1963 U.S. Pan American team will compete in the west's swimming classic. The meet has attracted seven world record holders, the famous John Konrad, Olympic Gold Medal winner from Australia, and the European champions, Hans Klein, West Germany and Miss Paoli Saini, Italy.

DRAG RACE STARS CLASH AT LIONS STRIP

Don Prudhomme, 23, pilot of the competition, holds the record at Lions Drag Strip for both speed and time.

Jack, hurt seriously a few months back, has turned the driving of the racer over to Roger Wolford. The Fords of Pelican Hill Performance and Stan Williams, both of Torrance, are favorites in their classes as is Jerold McClary in his '63 Austin.
