

McCoy Aims at Honors in CRA Field



THE REAL MCCOY! — That's what they call San Diego's ace driver, Bob McCoy, out at Ascot Park, 183rd and Vermont, Gardena, where the roaring California Racing Assn. big cars roll every Wednesday night throughout the summer. McCoy has been coming along fast and is giving favorites Bob Hogle and Allen Heath a real battle.

Finally coming into his own these days out at Ascot Park every Wednesday night in the roaring California Racing Association's big car races is San Diego's Bob McCoy, who is challenging such greats as Bob Hogle and Allen Heath with each succeeding 30-lapper at the 183rd and Vermont Gardena oval.

McCoy, one of the veterans of the tough CRA circuit, has driven a variety of cars thus far this season at Ascot, but seems to have found a real ride in the potent Ted's Valley Cadillac Chevy of North Hollywood.

McCoy has zoomed into a solid seventh position in current CRA point standings, and in the last four races has placed a good third, a fourth and two fifths in the main events.

Still the driver to beat at Ascot, however, is handsome Bob Hogle of Buena Park, way out in front of standings and winner of no less than five main events to date, four at Ascot.

Right behind the confi-

dent Hogle is the amazing one-armed vet, Northridge's Allen Heath, himself a three-time winner at Ascot; huge Dee Jones of Phoenix, second-ranked driver; San Gabriel's Ray Douglas.
