 'I'm Shook Up'
 Chief Bennett's comment to newsmen: "I'm shook up, I've got nothing to hide."
 Investigators' questions of city officials indicated, however, a widespread knowledge of local police personnel, their personal affairs and habits, and a sound understanding of the inner workings of the department. There was no indication who had called for the investigation, but indications were the district attorney's office had been preparing for it for some time.
 Manley J. Bowler, chief deputy district attorney, who announced the investigation late Monday, said, "We have no knowledge of widespread criminal activity within the department. However, there is nothing more heinous than criminal activity by those individuals who are sworn to uphold and not violate the law."
 "We feel it is incumbent upon us that we launch an investigation into the complete activities of the three officers, their associates and prior activities."
